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

## Holiday Bazaar

The Annual Holiday Bazaar, coordinated by UMW, will be held **Sunday, December 9**, from 10:30 until 4:00 in various rooms of the church.

Available for sale in Fellowship Hall will be the traditional Christmas cookies, candies, sweet and savory snacks, and other home-made treats. This year, the Christmas Revisited tables will have a wide variety of different items.

A new feature for 2018 will be vendors, who will be set up in the Garden Room and other rooms in that area as necessary. Among these vendors will be Tender Hug Bears, Blue Lighting Toys, Thirty One, Color Street Nails, Lula Roe, Elevaity, Usborne, Scentsy, Origami Owl, Life Expressions, and Doterra. Their items available for purchase include homemade dog treats, hand-made jewelry, embroidery, and Christmas crafts

If you have been making any crafts at home for the sale, they should be brought to church by **Wednesday, December 5**, so they can be priced in time for the sale.

Your donations of Christmas cookies (please provide at least three dozen if possible, and be sure to identify the types) can be brought to church on **Saturday, December 8**, between 9:00 and 3:00, when tables and displays are being set up.

An event like this sale needs many helping hands. A sign-up sheet is on the notice board in the narthex. Be sure to sign up to help in any way, such as setting up on Saturday, December 8, and/or cashiering, bagging, cleaning up, or in any of the many ways helping hands are needed on the day of the sale. Despite the work involved, you can have a good time!

Many thanks for your support in any capacity. This year, contrary to past practices, UMW plans to donate a portion of its sale proceeds to the church to help with its future planning.

## Silent Auction

Included as a part of the Holiday Bazaar is a Silent Auction. This year, Pat Garrigues donated three Santa Clauses, which are on display in the narthex. Two of them have minimum bids of \$25, while the other one has a minimum bid of \$20. Any incremental bids should be at least \$5.00. On the table in front of each Santa Claus are sheets, where you enter your name and telephone number and your bid. The winning bid will be announced at the end of the Holiday Bazaar on Sunday, December 9. Please be generous with your bids as the proceeds from this Silent Auction will be included in the overall total of the Holiday Bazaar and will help our church.

## Church Library

The church library is in the library corner of Fellowship Hall. This fall, all the books that had been donated over the summer months, those that were removed from the UMW Reading Program shelves because they were no longer eligible and were recategorized, and the new books for the UMW Reading program were processed and put on the shelves.

Our library has a wide variety of books, such as Bible commentaries; Bible studies by Bible book and by topic; biographies; Christian Living divided into subsections of Health and Fitness, Social Issues, and Women's Interests; Personal Spirituality, which includes books of devotions, meditations, how to grow in your faith, prayer, and theology; United Methodism, which has volumes of John Wesley's sermons (a new addition) and the history of the development of our denomination; books on world geography, history, and religions; the UMW Reading Program; Fiction; and books both for both youth and for children.

Books can be checked out at any time. Instructions for the check-out procedures are given on the cabinet in the library corner. Books may be checked out for three weeks; if the time period is any longer, the books tend to go missing. Contact Gwenda Szczygielski with any questions about the church library.

She often shares, “I was sitting at home waiting to die, now I have a purpose”

## **Our Lord's United Methodist Church Administrative Council Minutes**

Nov. 14, 2018

### **Present**

Perry Huyck, Dick Jones, Amy Kesler, Andrew Krier, Jane Mackey, Rebecca and Mark Radick, Dave Smith and Joe Whyms

### **Opening**

Dick Jones opened the meeting with prayer and the minutes were approved (R. Radick/J. Mackey).

### **Trustees – Jane Mackey**

Jane provided the following updates:

- The United Methodist Women group is promoting the annual Holiday Bazaar on Dec. 9, 10:30 am – 4:00 pm, in the community and inviting outside vendors to participate.
- Signage within the church is being updated to reflect any changes made during the year.
- Jane will evaluate options to improve the main sign on Sunnyslope.
- Interest has been expressed to enlarge the garden and possibly rent it out within the community. A proposal will be developed and considered at the Church Council meeting in March.
- Pictures donated by Hans and Helen Tanner will be hung within the church.
- Spurred by a book, Radical Hospitality, the Christian Living class is suggesting we begin a Shepherds team within the church to help guide visitors and new members. We are looking for 3-4 people to be part of a team. Training will be provided. Please contact Elizabeth.

### **Church Administration – Dave Smith**

A nominations committee consisting of Amy, Dave and Perry was formed to identify, recruit and nominate church members to serve on the 2019 Administrative Council

and align people to teams to move our church forward. Everyone is encouraged to volunteer and get involved.

### **Finance – Joe Whyms**

Income for October was \$23,522, under budget by \$2,859, while expenses for October were \$23,329, under budget by \$3,053 resulting in a negative cash flow of \$193 for the month. October income included \$1,895 of Special Funds for the GAP appeal to cover the budget shortfall. Year-to-date income was \$231,595, under budget by \$33,595, while expenses were \$250,569, under budget by \$14,620, resulting in a negative cash flow of \$18,975 year-to-date. This equates to an average monthly negative cash flow of \$1,897 for the first ten months of the year. A complete financial summary is available through the church office.

A preliminary budget was reviewed for 2019. Given that we have some unknowns as we go into 2019, the budget conservatively projects a minor deficit for the year. The Council was comfortable in recommending the budget recognizing that our vacant full-time pastor position will likely offset the deficit. The preliminary budget was approved (P. Huyck/A. Krier). The group feels good about the year ahead and looks forward to sharing the budget with the congregation during our Annual Charge Conference in January.

Our Lord's UMC will host our Circuit's Thanksgiving Service this year. The Council voted that any offering received will go towards the World Service portion of apportionments to the United Methodist Conference (P. Huyck/R. Radick).

### **Closing**

Our annual Charge Conference will be held in January to allow us time to better understand our pastoral situation.

Dave adjourned the regularly scheduled meeting.

Our next regularly scheduled Administrative Council meeting will be held on Dec. 4, 2018 at 7:00 pm and will include training by Dick Jones on leading with a single governance model.
